YMCA SUMMER DAY CAMP

Welcome to YMCA Day Camp! At YMCA Day Camp, kids have fun while they learn how to make new friends, build new skills and grow in self-reliance. Studies show that under the careful guidance of trained, certified counselors, kids grow and flourish in positive identity, social skills, physical and thinking skills, as well as the important areas of positive values and spirituality. These concepts of independence and discovery come into play every day at YMCA Day Camp.

Our Day Camps have programs for children entering grades Kindergarten to 6.

REGISTRATION

General registration will begin on **Monday March 5, 2012**. Registration ends when camp reaches maximum capacity. Every camp has a limited number of spaces available. Once we have reached that limit, registration will end. You can register at the Clovis Family YMCA or online at ymcacnm.org. **Early registration is advised, as camps fill quickly.**

What do I need to register?

- 1st week's payment
- \$5 per week deposit for each week your child will attend. Holds your child's spot for the week. This is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Camp Supply Fee (shirt, water bottle & back pack): \$20
- Current copy of your child's shot records
- Completely fill out your child's registration form and enrollment agreement

DATES

Day Camp runs from Wednesday, May 29 to Friday August 10, 2012. There will be **no camp on the 4th of July.**

HOURS

Day Camp is open Monday - Friday from 6:30 am - 6 pm. Curriculum components are facilitated from 9 am - 5 pm.

AGES

Children entering grades Kindergarten to sixth in the Fall are eligible to attend Day Camp. Children entering Kindergarten must be **5 years** of age by **May 29, 2012**.

CLOVIS DAY CAMP LOCATION

YMCA Day Camp will be held at the **newly renovated YRB Building** on the corner of 7th street and Sycamore. YMCA will have access to the splash pad, indoor aquatic center and Clovis Zoo!

1ST DAY OF CAMP

If possible, the first day parents may want to spend a few minutes looking around the environment with young children. It is also helpful to bring children to pre-visit the "Y" to see the environment and meet the counselors. Feel free to call and check on how your child is doing.

What should my child bring to Camp?

- Morning snack, lunch & afternoon snack
- Dress in comfortable clothing and tennis shoes (flip flops/sandals should not be worn to camp).
- A water bottle and backpack to store personal items
- Sunscreen with child's name, will stay at camp for daily use.
- Swim suit and towel on swim days only. It is highly recommended that children wear swimsuit under regular clothing to camp on swim days.

Please be sure to write child's name on all of the above items.

What not to bring to Camp

Please do not send personal items such as toys and electronics to camp.

DAY CAMP WEEKLY THEMES

Summer Theme: *Great things start here...YMCA Day Camp!*

WEEK 1 (May 29 – June 1): Super Y Kids

Summer jump start week. Jump in and learn the rules and routines and become a summer super Y kid!

WEEK 2 (June 4 – 8): Up, Up and Away

Travel the world with us this week. We'll make plenty of stops and there will be sights to see... So, Up, Up and Away We Go!!!

WEEK 3 (June 11 – 15): Aliens at the Y

Attention Campers: they come in peace! Our friendly visitors from another planet are here to teach us their ways in friendship and fun!

WEEK 4 (June 18 – 22): Willy Wonka's Factory

Measure, pour, stir and wa-la...you have created a scientific masterpiece! Blast off with our Mad Scientists as we discover the wonders that surround us. Investigate, inspect and detect what makes things tick, tock, or shoot through the air!

WEEK 5 (June 25 – 29): Go for the Gold

Participate in Y-Olympics outdoor adventures such as relays, scavenger hunts and group games. Focus is on discovering the outdoors, physical fitness and team building activities. Incorporates hands on learning about the surrounding environment specifically wild plants, critters and forest ecosystems.

WEEK 6 (July 2 – 6): Rookie of the Year

It's time to step up to the plate for games galore & sports of all sorts. We're going to hit one out of the park this week!

WEEK 7 (July 9 – 13): Super Slime

No need to shower this week, it's all about the yuck. It's time to get Sloppy and Slimy. We are sure to have a mess of a good time!

WEEK 8 (July 16 – 20): Rock my Y

The wonders of art await. Bring your imagination and creativity and make the world your canvas!

WEEK 9 (July 23 – 27): Y Scene Investigators

Get off the couch and live your favorite shows. There are no reruns, so make sure you fast forward your way to the Y for a great time!

WEEK 10 (July 30 – August 3): A Bugs Life

Are you nuts for nature? Discover all about the weather, trees, birds, animals, preserving our environment and more! Take a hike, go bird watching, plant flowers and scavenge for critters. This week includes outdoor activities and nature crafts using Earth's materials.

WEEK 11 (August 6 – 10): Back to the Future

The great mystery of Time Travel has been debated for many, many years but has someone finally figured it out? Can you really go back to the future? We will explore the possibilities of travelling through the past or even into the future!

SWIMMING AND FIELD TRIPS

Field trips are scheduled to enhance summer learning experience of each weekly theme. Trips will be scheduled on the same days each week (Example: Tuesdays – Swim/Thursdays – Fieldtrips). Check with each camp regarding camp specific days. Campers will participate in one field trip and swim trip per week. There will be no field trips or swim trips the first or last weeks of camp. First week participants will form rules, teams, and familiarity with Day Camp schedules. Last week participants will wind down preparing to return to school and celebrate the end of a wonderful summer. Camp Tee-Shirts are REQUIRED on field trip days. If campers wish to bring money on trips, please be aware that the YMCA will not assume any responsibility for lost or stolen cash.

Parents or family members are encouraged to join in on the fun of camp. To volunteer, an application should be completed and turned to your site coordinator. An internet background check will be processed before event. If background check does not clear, individuals will not be permitted to volunteer. Please make sure this is completed no less than a week before the date you plan to volunteer.

MEALS

The YMCA applies for the city's free lunch program every year, but is not guaranteed to be accepted as a meal site. Last year we have been part of the program and hope to continue to do so again this year. In the event that your Y location is not selected, parents will need to provide a morning snack, lunch and afternoon snack on a daily basis.

First & last week of camp

The City's lunch program does not run during these weeks, so please plan to send a non-perishable morning snack, sack lunch and an afternoon snack.

All other weeks

Provided that the YMCA has been selected as a meal site for the city's free breakfast and lunch program, parents will only need to provide an afternoon snack.

Fieldtrip Days

On certain fieldtrip days, a non-perishable sack lunch may be recommended.

Special Diets

In the event a special diet is required, parents may be asked to provide daily lunch. Please speak with the director to come up with a solution that best fits dietary needs.

MEDICATION

State childcare regulations require the Y to only administer medication prescribed by a doctor. It must be in the original container, and a medical form must be filled out and left with the counselor in advance before medication is administered.

- Medication must go home for the weekend and brought back each Monday. A new form will need to be filled out weekly.
- The Y does not provide or distribute over the counter medication.
- The Y does not give children shots for any reason.
- Children may not administer their own medication, will be supervised at all times.
- *SUNSCREEN* is considered a form of medication. Parents are asked to provide an individual supply for each child with their name written on the bottle. Children will not be allowed to share.
- Please inform the on-site staff of any food allergies.

STAFF

The Y spends months screening and recruiting summer camp staff. We look for individuals who are energetic, outgoing and self-motivated. The Y selects people that are caring and sensitive to a child's individual needs. The following are requirements of all summer staff before hired:

- 18 years of age and older
- Clear criminal background screening
- Clear drug screening
- CPR & First Aid certified

- Complete Blood Borne pathogens, child abuse prevention, and 16 hours of day camp specific training (pool safety, communicating with parents, facilitating camp schedules and activities, field trip safety, and more).
- Adhere to a strict code of conduct

All Y drivers, transporting children must meet additional requirements:

- Must be 21 years of age
- Must have a clean driving record
- Must be approved by insurance carrier
- Must take an 8 hour defensive driving course

PARENT ORIENTATION

It is important that parents attend our camp orientation so that you will have a chance to meet our camp staff and have a better understanding of how camp operates. It will also give you a chance to ask questions you may have.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •First weeks fees, \$5 deposit per week registering for, and \$20 registration fee are due in full before attendance. •\$5 weekly deposit holds participants spot in weeks desired and is placed toward the weekly fee. Deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable. A two week notice is to be given to disenroll from weeks a spot is held or weekly payment in full must be made. •\$20 deposit pays for participants' tee-shirt (required for all field trips), water bottle, and back pack. •Weekly fees are due no later than 6:00 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the week's service is to be provided. If payment is not received by Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. for the following week, a \$10.00 late charge will be added to the amount due. •The YMCA does not accept temporary checks or cash payments at day camp locations. •The YMCA offers automatic payment withdrawal options, please see the front desk for more information. •There is a \$5 discount for a second child attending from a family, and for every subsequent child from that family. •Signing participants in and out on a daily basis is required. •Late Pick-Up Fee: The YMCA Day Camp hours are 6:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. There is a late pick-up charge of \$1.00 per minute, or portion thereof for each child picked up after 6:00 p.m. Fee is due before or on the next day of attendance. •Medications must be in the original container and can only be administered if prescribed by a physician. •The YMCA will not be responsible for personal property brought from home. Games, electronic toys, and other items are not allowed at camp. •Damage to any property or vehicle that occurs from a deliberate act of any participant, while attending our programs, will be repaired or replaced at full expense by the child's parent or guardian. •The YMCA reserves the right to disenroll participants at any time.
